- 1. Position: Assistant professor (permanent), 1 person.
- 2. Job description:

Working together with GWPO researchers the successful applicant will take a leading role in the construction and commissioning of the KAGRA detector. After construction is completed he/she will be expected to support the operation of KAGRA and contribute to gravitational wave science.

- 3. <u>Start of the term</u>: As soon as possible after the offer is made.
- 4. <u>Place of work</u>:

The position will be based at the Gravitational Wave Project Office (GWPO) in Kamioka, Hida-city, Gifu-prefecture, Japan. However, for the purpose of conducting commissioning activities, the successful applicant may be based in Kashiwa-city, Chiba-prefecture, until the end of March 2016 at the latest.

5. <u>Qualifications</u>:

Applicants must have a Ph.D. in physics or expect to have one by the time the position starts.
